N ationalism

Ethnic groups demanded their own independent nations - especially diverse nationalities ruled by Austria-Hungary.

Nationalism also made people more prone to support warfare against other nations in defense of perceived national interests.

## TROUBLE IN THE BALKANS

The Balkan Peninsula had for centuries been a borderland between the Ottoman and Austrian Empires. The rise of nationalism and the decline of the Ottoman Empire brought instability to the region.

In 1914, a group of **Serbian nationalists** known as the **Black Hand** orchestrated the assassination of **Archduke Franz Ferdinand**, the heir to the throne of Austria-Hungary, during his visit to **Sarajevo**.
